Charitable Man follows sire in achieving Futurity victory

After stalking the pace from five wide, Charitable Man took control in the stretch to secure a one-length victory in the 119th running of the Futurity Stakes (G2) on September 13 at Belmont Park.

The two-year-old Lemon Drop Kid colt followed in the footsteps of his sire, who captured the prestigious race a decade ago.

Charitable Man covered seven furlongs in 1:24.30 on a main track rated as good. He is unbeaten in two starts following an impressive front-running 1½-length victory in a 6½-

furlong maiden special weight race on August 10 at Saratoga Race Course.

Trained by Kieran McLaughlin, Charitable Man is being pointed to the Champagne Stakes (G1) on October 4 at Belmont.

Bred in Virginia by Edward P. Evans, the dark bay or brown colt was sold for \$200,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September yearling sale. He is

the first winner in Florida from two starters out of the Saint Ballado mare Charitable donation, a stakes winner in Florida at three.

Charitable Man has an unnamed yearling half brother by Stormy Atlantic and a weanling full sister. Their winning grandam, In the Will, is a half sister to Japanese stakes winner Admire Mambo, by Kingmambo.

This clan is anchored by Charitable Man's fifth

as well as the third dam of Grade 1 winner Bob and John.

Charitable Man hails from the fifth crop of the Kingmambo stallion Lemon Drop Kid and is one of his sire's ten graded stakes winners.

Lemon Drop Kid stands at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The five-time Grade 1 winner becomes the 11th Futurity Stakes winner to sire at least one Futurity winner (see chart).

His Grade 1-winning fillies include 2006 Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner Lemons Forever, 2007 Gamely Stakes (G1) heroine Citronnade, and '07 Ashland Stakes (G1) winner Christmas Kid. To date, 21 of Lemon Drop Kid's 31 stakes winners have been fillies.

Only five Futurity winners have subsequently gone on to capture the Kentucky Derby (G1): the prodigious quintet of Citation, Riva Ridge, Secretariat, Affirmed, and Swale.
