Precious Kitten capitalizes on purr-fect trip in Gamely

Beneficiary of the coveted cathird seat, 6-to-5 favorite Precious Kitten stalked pacesetter Diamond Diva before taking command at the head of the stretch en route to a comfortable 2½-length victory in the

\$283,000 Gamely Stakes (G1) on May 26 at Hollywood Park.

It was the first victory of the year for the five-year-old dark bay or brown mare, who covered 1½ miles on firm turf in 1:45.23. It also marked a record eighth Gamely triumph for Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel.

Last season, Precious Kitten

was an Eclipse Award finalist for outstanding turf female when capturing four graded stakes, including the John C. Mabee Handicap (G1) and the Matriarch Stakes (G1). She then was purchased privately by Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stables from her owner-breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey.

The Gamely is her eighth victory from 21 lifetime starts with earnings totaling \$1,602,088.

Precious Kitten hails from the second crop of the stakes-winning Storm Cat stallion Catienus. New York's leading sire in 2006 and '07, Catienus returned to Ramsey Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky, with a '08 fee of \$10,000. He also is the sire of Grade 1 winner Dawn Of War.

Bred in Kentucky, Precious Kitten descends from an increasingly prominent female family. Of note, her first three dams as well as an older half sister all have become Grade 1-winning producers.

Precious Kitten's dam, the Lear Fan mare Kitten's First, won one race from two starts at age two. Her first foal, multiple stakes winner Justenuffheart, by Broad Brush, has gone on to produce the Grade 2-winning Rahy colt Lewis Michael as well as his full sister, '06 champion juvenile filly Dreaming Of Anna.

Kitten's First is also the dam of Kitten's Joy, by El Prado, who was named the 2004 Eclipse champion turf male at age three.

Kitten's First had to be euthanized in January '06 after foundering. Her half brother, Down The Aisle, by Runaway Groom, captured the 2000 United Nations Handicap (G1).

Precious Kitten's grand dam, That's My Hon, is a half sister to Road

Princess, winner of the 1977 Mother Goose Stakes (G1) and dam of Grade 2 winner Reign Road.

The family is anchored by Precious Kitten's multiple stakes winning fourth dam Danger Ahead who also serves as the third dam of the great champion Spectacular Bid.

One of the less common progenitors appearing in our subject's fifth generation is Danger Ahead's sire Head Play. The Preakness Stakeswinning son of Man o' War's full brother My Play, Head Play is best known for his famous nose loss to Broker's Tip in the Kentucky Derby's "Fighting Finish" of 1933.
