## Big 'Cap winner Misremembered overcame unflattering early impressions

Well suited to stalk early on, Misremembered assumed the lead near the quarter pole and then held off a torrid late challenge from Neko Bay to score a half-length victory in the 73rd running of the \$750,000 Santa Anita Handicap (G1) on March 6.

The four-year-old Candy Ride (Arg) ridgling was sent off as the 4.40-to-1 third choice in a field of 14. His final time for 1½ miles on the synthetic Pro-Ride surface was 2:00.20.



MISREMEMBERED

This tour-de-force for Misremembered ended his streak of three consecutive second-place finishes in the Strub (G2) and Malibu (G1) Stakes and the Clark Handicap (G2).

Unraced at two, Misremembered's sophomore campaign was highlighted by victories in the Swaps Stakes (G2) and Indiana Derby (G2). The chestnut's colt's career

mark stands at five wins and four seconds from eleven starts and earnings of \$1.188.589.

Misremembred was bred in Kentucky by his Racing Hall of Fame trainer, Bob Baffert, who conditions the homebred for his wife, Jill, and co-owner George Jacobs.

Baffert, who is known for his colorful animal metaphors, was caught reminiscing in the aftermath of the Big 'Cap on how Misremembered looked more like a camel or a kangaroo as a young foal. So much for early impressions.

Misremembered is one of five winners from six starters out of the talented Quack mare Beyond Perfection, who captured the 1990 Del Mar Debutante Stakes (G2) at two and the Bay Meadows Oaks (G3) at three.

As a broodmare, however, Beyond Perfection has suffered chronic problems getting her foals to term. Baffert bought her for \$7,000 as a 17-year-old at the 2005 Keeneland January horses of all ages sale. Prior to Misremembered, she produced just one live foal in six years and has not yielded another one since.

Misremembered's broodmare sire, Quack, annexed the 1972 Holly-

wood Gold Cup Invitational Handicap at three and equaled the world record for 1½ miles in 1:58.20. So far, Quack's daughters have combined to produce 58 stakes winners from 1242 foals of racing age (4.7%), including three Grade 1 or Group 1 winners.

Misremembered's grandam, Miss Imorullah, was a stakes winner in Ohio and the dam of Ohio stakes winner True West, by Buffalo Lark. Miss Imorullah was the best filly sired by the obscure Swaps stallion Black Beard, winner of the 1962 Jerome Handicap.

The only other graded stakes winner within this immediate family is Grade 2 winner Onceinabluemamoon, who shares the same third dam, Imorullah, as our subject.

A five generation outcross, Misremembered became the third first-crop Grade 1 winner for his sire, the increasingly prominent Ride The Rails stallion Candy Ride (Arg), who stands for \$25,000 at Lane's End in Versailles, Kentucky.
