

Neko Bay nets elusive first stakes score in San Pasqual

Under left-handed urging by jockey Mike Smith, Neko Bay found his best stride in midstretch and drove clear of six challengers to record his first stakes victory by 1\% lengths in the \\$150,000 San Pasqual Stakes (G2) on January 9 at Santa Anita Park.

Trained by John Shirreffs for owners-breeders Jerry and Ann Moss, Neko Bay covered $1\frac{1}{16}$ miles on the synthetic Pro-Ride surface in 1:42.95.

It may have taken some time, but this lightly raced seven-year-old Giant's Causeway horse finally performed up to his stellar pedigree.

Neko Bay entered off a third-place finish in the Native Diver Handicap (G3) at Hollywood Park on December 12, the latest of his four previous stakes-placings.

Not exactly robust in appearance, the dark bay or

brown horse has never made more than four starts in any of his five seasons of racing. His career mark stands at five wins—all at Santa Anita—from 13 starts and earnings of \$323,020.

Bred in Kentucky, Neko Bay is one of four winners from as many starters out the Rubiano mare Brulay, whom the Mosses purchased for \$150,000 at the 1996 Keeneland September yearling sale from the consignment of Lane's End, agent.

Brulay won her first three starts at three, including the Railbird Stakes (G2) in which she beat 2001 champion older female Gourmet Girl.

Brulay's three stakes-winning siblings include 2000 champion older male and sire Lemon Drop Kid, by Kingmambo, and Group 3 winner Statue of Liberty, by Storm Cat.

This is the immediate family of 1992 Broodmare of the Year Weekend Surprise and her sons, classic winners and sires A.P. Indy and Summer Squall. This also is the clan of Grade 1 or Group 1 winners Court Vision, Wolfhound, and Duke of Marmalade (Ire).

Neko Bay hails from the second crop of the illustrious Storm Cat

stallion Giant's Causeway, who led all North American sires in 2009 by stakes winners and graded and group stakes winners as well as progeny earnings.

Named after a majestic inlet on the Antarctic peninsula, Neko Bay enjoys a pedigree that is greater even than the considerable sum of its parts.

The cross of Storm Bird and Nijinsky II, 3x4, continues to represent one of Northern Dancer's most successful tandems through which to inbreed. Half brothers Secretariat and Sir Gaylord appear, 4x5, generating another auspicious duplication of their influential dam, Somethingroyal.

Perhaps strongest of all is the affinity Giant's Causeway has shared with Mr. Prospector-line broodmares, a select lot who have combined to yield almost 48% of his 42 graded or group stakes winners while issuing less than 27% of his total foals of racing age.
