Spinaway winner carries valuable cross of full brothers

In her second lifetime start, Grace Hall again was much the best as the two-year-old Empire Maker filly drew off late to take the seven-furlong Spinaway Stakes (G1) by 1¼ lengths on September 4 at Saratoga Race Course.

Trainer Tony Dutrow signed the ticket for \$95,000 to purchase the bay filly at the 2010 Keeneland September yearling sale.

Bred by Darley, she is one of three winners from four starters out of the Ezzoud (Ire) mare Season's Greetings (Ire), a stakes winner in France at two and multiple group stakes-placed in France at two and three.

An indifferent stallion, Ezzoud is not the typical broodmare sire of a Spinaway winner. As a racehorse, he captured back-to-back runnings of the about 1½-mile Juddmonte International Stakes (Eng-G1) at York.

Grace Hall's unraced grandam, Dream Season, is a full sister to French group 3 winner Elizabeth Bay. The latter also is the dam of graded stakes winner Bayeux and second dam of 2010 Prix Ganay (Fr-G1) winner Cutlass Bay.

The immediate family is anchored by Grace Hall's celebrated third dam, multiple Grade 1 winner Life At the Top, clearly one of her generation's best fillies.

Further back, Grace Hall's extended American family flourished at Warren Wright's legendary Calumet Farm.

In 1931, Wright bought our subject's eighth dam, 1924 Preakness Stakes winner Nellie Morse, for \$6,100 while in foal to the Man o' War stallion American Flag. The subsequent foal, Calumet's first stakes-winning homebred Nellie Flag, was consensus champion two-year old filly for 1934. Her daughter Nellie

L. followed with wins in the 1943 Kentucky Oaks and Acorn Stakes.

In turn, Nellie L.'s daughter, the foundation mare Comely Nell, appears as Grace Hall's fifth dam. She is best known as the dam of 1976 champion three-year-old male Bold Forbes and the second dam of unbeaten Saratoga Six.

Grace Hall hails from the fifth American crop of Empire Maker, the leading third-crop sire by 2009 earnings, who was sold in November 2010 to the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association.

The former Juddmonte homebred now stands at the Shizunai Stallion Station on the northern island of Hokkaido.

So far, six of Empire Maker's seven Grade 1 winners have been fillies.

Grace Hall's pedigree is highlighted by a 3x4 cross of El Gran Senor and his older full brother Try My Best, a pair of English/Irish champions who shared their prominent connections having been bred by E. P. Taylor, conditioned by Vincent O'Brien, and campaigned by Robert Sangster.

The reverse of this relatively uncommon cross (Try My Best over El Gran Senor 4x2) appeared in the pedigree of globe-trekking Ramonti, a five-time Group 1 winner in 2006 and 2007.

A more recent example of inbreeding to full siblings from this family is Chinchon (Ire), who is inbred 3x3 to Try My Best and his full sister Northern Prancer. Chinchon captured last year's Betfair/TVG United Nations Stakes (G1) at Monmouth Park and came back with a runner-up effort in the same race this season.

Look for more of these superior individuals whose pedigrees demonstrate inbreeding to the family of 1982 Broodmare of the Year Best in Show.
