Treasure Beach had right pedigree to succeed in Irish Derby

TREASURE BEACH

Already Europe's premier sire, Galileo (Ire) has been enjoying a truly phenomenal season with six major European classic victories from five different winners.

On Sunday at the Curragh, his son Treasure Beach became the fifth consecutive winner of the Dubai Duty Irish Derby (Ire-G1) who is a paternal grandson of the recently deceased breed-shaping sire-of-sires Sadler's Wells (see accompanying chart).

Amazingly, the Sadler's Wells line has won ten of the last 14 runnings of Irish Derby and 13 in all.

Moreover and as frequently noted in this column, crossing the male line of Sadler's Wells with mares carrying the blood of Never Bend (creating inbreeding to the key matron Lalun) continues to be a disproportionately common pattern among the winning pedigrees of Europe's premier events. This season, however, there has been a relative avalanche of them.

In the case of Treasure Beach, his dam, the placed Mark of Esteem (Ire) mare Honorine, is of the Never Bend broodmare sire line through his key son, Mill Reef. Carrying a second strain, Honorine is actually

inbred to Never Bend, 5x4.

Two days before Treasure Beach's Derby, Etihad Airways Irish One Thousand Guineas (Ire-G1) winner Misty For Me easily outran her elder Midday (GB) to win the Stobart Ireland Pretty Polly Stakes (Ire-G1) at the Curragh. The Galileo filly's pedigree includes Never Bend as the sire of her third dam, Anne Campbell.

As for Ireland's two remaining classics, the last three Irish St. Legers (Ire-G1) have been won by representatives of the Sadler's Wells line out of mares from the line of Never Bend's grandson Shirley Heights. Similarly, two of Sadler's Wells' three Irish Oaks (Ire-G1) winners have demonstrated the same prodigious cross.

This year's Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (Fr-G1) (French One Thousand Guineas) and Prix de Diane Longines (Fr-1) (French Oaks) winner Golden Lilac is yet another daughter of Galileo with the seemingly ubiquitous Never Bend appearing within her pedigree's bottom half.

Sarafina, who captured last year's French Oaks, came back with a dramatic victory against males in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud (Fr-G1) on Sunday at Longchamp. She is by the Sadler's Wells stallion Refuse To Bend (Ire) out of a mare by the Shirley Heights stallion Darshaan.

Three weekends earlier on June 4 in the Investec Epsom Derby (Eng-G1), Treasure Beach suffered a tough head loss to Pour Moi, who is by the Sadler's Wells stallion Montjeu (Ire) out of a mare by Darshaan.

A day later, the Prix du Jockey Club (Fr-G1) (French Derby) was taken by Reliable Man, a son of the Darshaan stallion Dalakhani out of a Sadler's Wells mare—the cross in reverse.

So far, individuals demonstrating the fortuitous tandem of Sadler's Wells and Never Bend, particularly through Darshaan, have scored in a total of six classics in England, Ireland, and France this season, including all three Derbys.

As for Treasure Beach, his extended pedigree also demonstrates inbreeding to the families of Northern Dancer and *Vaguely Noble, only adding to the blend of complementary elements.

This, then, is a spot-on mating with a world beater of a stallion and a very powerful affinity.
