

Frumious smokes 'em in Palos Verdes romp

Unbridled speed certainly was at a premium on January 21 as Frumious carved out blistering fractions only to expand his lead throughout the stretch en route to a commanding 5%-length victory in the \$150,000 Palos Verdes Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park.

The Palos Verdes was the first stakes triumph for the sixyear-old Grindstone gelding, who clearly relished the sealed main track labeled wet-fast. Sent off as the 6.30-to-1 fifth betting choice in a competitive field of six, Frumious covered six furlongs in a scorching 1:07.28.

Scorching, indeed. English literature buffs will note the word 'frumious' was created by famed Victorian author Lewis Carroll, who first used it in his 1871 poem *Jabberwocky* as a blend of fuming and furious.

The Palos Verdes was the third straight victory for Frumious, who could have been claimed for \$40,000 out of the first victory during the streak.

The lightly raced gelding now has won six of his 15 lifetime starts and earned \$259,192. He could be pointed to the \$2-million Dubai Golden Shaheen (UAE-G1) on March 31 at Meydan Racecourse.

Bred in California by JayArDee Stables, Frumious fetched \$17,000 at the 2007 Barretts Equine Ltd. January mixed sale. He is the first foal out of the unraced Gold Legend mare Eternal Legend, a \$10,000 purchase at the 2005 Keeneland November breeding stock sale while carrying Frumious.

Eternal Legend also is the dam of the three-year old Tribal Rule gelding Eternal Rule, who is unbeaten in three starts in Canada, including the 2011 Achievement Stakes at Woodbine.

Frumious' grandam, Eternal Search, was a 15-time stakes winner and three-time Canadian champion having been named

the country's top sprinter in 1981 and champion older female in 1982 and 1983.

Anchoring his immediate family is his third dam, the unraced mare Bon Debarras. She is ancestress to an eclectic array of international stakes winners, including 2004 Queen's Plate Stakes winner Niigon and 2004 Acorn Stakes (G1) winner Island Sand.

Like so many other flourishing North American female lines, Frumious' extended family was developed by premier Canadian horseman E. P. Taylor, who bred our subject's fourth and fifth dams.

Frumious hails from the tenth crop of the Unbridled stallion Grindstone and represents the latest of his sire's ten group or graded stakes winners headed, of course, by 2004 Belmont Stakes (G1) winner and classic-winning sire Birdstone.

The first horse since Bubbling Over in 1926 to be retired immediately following a victory in the Kentucky Derby (G1), Grindstone spent his first 13 years at stud in Kentucky at Overbrook Farm.

In 2009, he was transferred to Oakhurst Thoroughbreds in Newburg, Oregon, making him the first Kentucky Derby winner to ever stand in the Northwest. His 2012 stud fee is \$2,500.
