Downhill queen Unzip Me gives 'em the slip

UNZIP ME

Determined as ever, Unzip Me padded her remarkable résumé with a sparkling half-length score in the \$86,600 Wishing

Well Stakes on January 29 at Santa Anita Park.

Unzip Me posted her sixth stakes victory on the track's unique downhill turf course, which wends a distance of about 6½ furlongs. Indeed, this makes her the most accomplished female in Santa Anita's 57-year history of running these novel sprint events.

Stakes namesake, Wishing Well, was an excellent downhill specialist and is the dam of Racing Hall of Famer and Japan's all-time leading sire Sunday Silence.

Quite appropriately then, Wishing Well enjoyed her best years of racing while co-owned and trained by Gary Jones whose son, Marty, just happens to train Unzip Me.

A ten-time stakes winner, Unzip Me has a lifetime record of 14 wins from 25 starts and earnings of \$959,228. On the Arcadia, California, track's specialty course, she has won seven of 11 starts.

Unzip Me was bred in California by Harris Farms and Donald Valpredo, a team that also is responsible for breeding her first three dams.

She is the first winner from three starters out of the winning Arazi mare Escape With Me, who currently carries a full sibling to Unzip Me.

At the heart of this immediate family is Unzip Me's brilliant grandam, Soviet Problem. She was named California's 1994 horse of the year as a four-year-old after she toyed with her peers, beat males on four occasions, and then ran a gallant and perhaps unlucky second to Cherokee Run in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) at Churchill Downs.

On a more personal note, as a former co-owner of one of Soviet Problem's many unfortunate foils, this author still remembers the recently deceased starlet as 'scary fast'.

Unzip Me and her grandam aside, this is a rather mediocre branch of the American female family (number 5-f) best known for

the issuance of the celebrated Grey Flight clan.

Six-year-old Unzip Me hails from the fourth crop of City Zip,

who stands at Lane's End in Versailles, Kentucky, for an advertised 2012 fee of \$20,000. The Carson City stallion ranked sixth by 2012 progeny earnings on Thoroughbred Times' general sire list through Tuesday.

It certainly is unusual for an active sire line to demonstrate a strongly disproportional share of chestnuts among its top progeny, and yet the Carson City branch of Mr. Prospector (such as the

Sharpen Up [GB] line in Europe) continues to exhibit this pattern.

In the case of City Zip, 11 of his 12 graded or group stakes winners and the overwhelming majority of his richest offspring have been chestnuts. This despite the genetics and foal records, which predict and confirm that less than half of his total progeny carry his coat color.

Unzip Me's pedigree also features a well-suited duplication of the cross Blushing Groom (Fr) over Nijinsky II through Carson City's dam Blushing Promise and Escape With Me.

This striking emblazoned chestnut, the downhill queen, now appears poised to become a millionaire.
