Pegasus winner Le Bernardin adds to family fortune

Darley Stable's Le Bernardin bounced back from a hapless last-place effort in the Peter Pan Stakes (G2) to take his first black-type event on Sunday, scoring a well-timed neck victory in the 1\%-mile Pegasus Stakes (G3) at Monmouth Park.

Unraced at two, the three-year old Bernardini colt's record stands at three wins from five starts with a bankroll of \$146,000.

Getting his name from a luxurious Times Square eatery, Le Bernardin was a \$325,000 purchase at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of selected yearlings.

The dark bay or brown colt was bred in Kentucky by Michael G. Rutherford, who also bred and raced his dam—the Wild Again mare La Rosa, best at age two when capturing the 1995

Demoiselle Stakes (G2).

From six starters, La Rosa has produced five winners, including 2006 Sabin Stakes (G3) winner Taittinger Rose, by Menifee. Le Bernardin also has an unraced two-vear-old full brother.

The most celebrated member of this im-

mediate clan is La Rosa's dam, 1985 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) winner Twilight Ridge. La Rosa's half sister, multiple stakes-winning filly Daylight Ridge, by Dayjur, is the dam of multiple stakes winner Independent George, by Cozzene.

Further back, this family was developed by eminent horseman Fred W. Hooper, who bred Le Bernardin's third and fourth dams, Waving Sky and Fading Sky, respectively, and purchased fifth dam Haze for \$8,500 at the 1954 Keeneland summer yearling sale.

The Olympia mare Haze, in fact, became one of Hooper's key foundation broodmares in Florida. Dam of three multiple stakes winners, including 1974 Whitney Handicap (G2) winner and useful sire Tri Jet, Haze subsequently served as ancestress to several dozen stakes winners, including 1978 Futurity Stakes (G1) victor Crested Wave, 1976 Hollywood Lassie Stakes (G2) heroine Wavy Waves, and 1979 Gulfstream Park Handicap (G1) winner Sensitive Prince.

Le Bernardin hails from the second crop of three-year champion and A.P. Indy scion Bernardini, who is both bred

and owned by Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Darley.

A pure breeding bay (no chestnuts), Bernardini has been shuttling between the Darley operations in Lexington and New South Wales, Australia. In a bit of a surprise, the initial Antipodean crop has been, at best, ineffective.

Quite a different story stateside where Bernardini continues to tantalize as a classic sire getting good numbers of runners logging quality time on the Triple Crown trail. Last year's Travers Stakes (G1) victory from first-crop son Stay Thirsty stands as his biggest accolade.

Bernardini currently enjoys a comfortable lead in progeny earnings among North American third-crop sires, ranking tenth overall.

Crossing the sons of A.P. Indy with daughters of Wild Again has not led to any statistical evidence of an affinity, but does include Grade 1 winner and Triple Crown aspirant Pyro, by Pulpit.

Could it be that Bernardini proves good enough to ultimately supplant Pulpit as A.P. Indy's best son at stud?

That would be a tall order, particularly since the latter has already become a flourishing sire-of-sires.

Notwithstanding, Bernardini figures to continue to benefit from an annual book of broodmares that is superior in both quantity and quality. This has certainly facilitated his brilliant early numbers of graded and group stakes winners, in particular Grade1 or Group 1 winners.
