



PEDIGREE PROFILE

Blueeyesintherein packs a rare double dose of Broadway

Angling out and taking command at the top of the stretch, Blueeyesintherein remained clear of her rivals through the lane to record her first stakes victory by 2½ lengths in last Saturday's 112th running of the Debutante Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs.

Installed as the even-money favorite in a field of ten, Blueeyesintherein completed the six furlong event, the year's first graded stakes for two-year old fillies, in 1:11.71 on a track rated fast.

She is now unbeaten in two starts having entered the Debutante off a facile maiden win at Churchill on May 31.

Blueeyesintherein represents the first stakes winner for her freshman sire Magna Graduate, who stands at Darby Dan Farm in Lexington.

Magna Graduate follows his late sire, Honor Grades, who spent the second half of his stud career at Darby Dan.

Blueeyesintherein's trainer, Garry Simms, purchased the dark bay or brown filly for \$10,000 at the 2011 Keeneland September yearling sale.

It would be a circle of fortune for Simms, who spent \$30,000 for the filly's sire Magna Graduate at the same sale eight years earlier, training the colt through his juvenile season.

At three, Magna Graduate was sold by his owner to Elisabeth

Alexander, whose opportune four-year campaign with the horse included seven graded stakes victories and more than \$2-million in earnings.

One generation later with Magna Graduate at stud, Alexander is credited with breeding his first exceptional runner, a filly as well as a Simms protégé.

Blueeyesintherein is the second winner from as many starters out of the winning Mr. Greeley mare Tartuffi.

Our subject also has a yearling full sister.

Up until now, this has been an immediate family dominated by moderate turf runners anchored by a key matriarch several generations back.

Blueeyesintherein's American family was initiated by Robert J. Kleberg Jr.'s King Ranch, who imported her celebrated fourth dam *Monade, the 1962 Epsom Oaks winner and champion three-year-old filly in England and France.

The large majority of Monade's premier descendants have been through her granddaughter, Grade 1 winner Too Chic, dam of 1991 champion older mare Queena, who foaled Grade 1 winner and sire Brahms. This cluster of top-level winners also includes Queena's full sister Chic Shirine.

The most distinct pattern within Blueeyesintherein's pedigree appears to be the cross of close relatives Fast Play and Reviewer, who share the same grandam and dam, respectively.

Inbreeding, 5x5, to the important Ogden Phipps matron Broadway is a result. Another key sire from this family is Fast Play's half brother Seeking the Gold.

Considering the relatives involved, this rarely encountered breeding strategy in which Broadway's complementary strains are crossed certainly appears to have merit.
