

Turbo Compressor runs on high-octane pedigree

Front- running four-year old Turbo Compressor was certainly firing on all cylinders as he cruised to a commanding 134-length victory in the \$505,000 United Nations Stakes (G1) on July 7 at Monmouth Park.

He won his first graded stakes in a rapidly improving career and earned a berth in the Breeders' Cup Turf (G1) at Santa Anita on November 3 as part of the "Win and You're In" Challenge Series.

Turbo Compressor has now won half of his 14 lifetime starts, accruing a bankroll of \$920,960.

A minor stakes winner on the dirt in 2011, he is a perfect three-for-three running on firm turf courses this season.

The bay Halo's Image ridgling was coming off a strong wire-to-wire effort that netted the Colonial Turf Cup on June 16.

Turbo Compressor and his success at the top level is a testament to the breeding acumen of late Florida horseman Arthur I. Appleton and his Bridlewood Farms in Ocala.

Accounting for all aspects of his proximate pedigree, Appleton is responsible for breeding Turbo Compressor, his sire, broodmare sire, and all of the immediate family including his first three dams.

Purchased for \$22,000 at the 2010 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. April two-year-olds in training sale, Turbo Compressor is one of five winners from as many starters out of the Wild Event mare Dixieland Event who, like her dam Pleasant Dixie, was unraced.

Dixieland Event also is dam of Stormy Dixie, by Stormy Atlantic, who set a course record for 1½ miles when capturing last year's Politely Stakes on the turf at Monmouth.

Most prominently, crossing our subject's sire, Halo's Image, with his grandam, Pleasant Dixie, produced Turbo Compressor's three-quarter brother, three-time Grade 1 winner and sire Southern Image.

Turbo Compressor's fourth dam, Jolie Jolie, was a foundation mare for Bridlewood, yielding four stakes winners, including our subject's third dam, Pleasant Jolie, and three-time Grade 1 winner and sire Jolie's Halo.

This appears to be a female family with an affinity for Haloline stallions. As it stands, all four Grade 1 winners in Turbo Compressor's female family tracing back to his fifth dam, Who's to Know, are of a Halo sire line.

Turbo Compressor's broodmare sire, 1999 Early Times Turf Classic Stakes (G1) winner Wild Event, spent a couple of years standing at Bridlewood before he was moved to Brazil, where he has become a champion sire.

Halo's Image topped Florida stallions' progeny earnings in 2004 and 2006, but died of an apparent heart attack in 2010.

Turbo Compressor is the first winner of the United Nations to represent the Halo sire line since the mean-spirited breed shaper Halo, won the race in 1974 when it was run at Atlantic City Race Course.

A five generation outcross, Turbo Compressor's pedigree demonstrates the auspicious pattern of a Halo-line stallion crossed with a mare not only from a 'Halo-philic' family, but inbred, 4x3, to Halo's close relative Northern Dancer.

Such an approach and its inbreeding to Almahmoud certainly has worked well in Japan with Halo's most accomplished son, Sunday Silence.
