## Another descendant of Flower Bowl wins the Flower Bowl

English-bred Ave (GB) earned Grade 1 honors for the first time on October 2 in the \$500,000 Flower Bowl Invitational Stakes (G1) as the four-year old Danehill Dancer filly boldly split opponents in deep stretch to score by a head.

Sent off as the 10.50-to-1 sixth betting choice in a strong field of seven, Ave completed  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles in 2:08.54 on yielding turf at Belmont Park.

Perhaps a type of proof of how well-named this race has become, eight of the last 15 winners have carried Flower Bowl's blood in their family tree. This key \*Alibhai mare, dam of the influential full brothers His Majesty and Graustark, appears in the fifth generation of our

subject's pedigree.

Ave was coming off a troubled eighth-place finish as the favorite in the Beverly D. Stakes (G1) on August 21 at Arlington Park. A Group 3 winner in England last season, her Grade 1 win improved her career mark to five wins from 14 lifetime starts and more than doubled her earnings to \$556,169.

The bottom half of Ave's pedi-

gree is particularly rich in stamina. Her winning dam, Anna Amalia, by In the Wings (GB), also has produced the three-year old Dubawi colt Dubawi Phantom, who is English group stakes-placed at two and three.

Ave's grandam, Anna of Saxony (GB), by Ela-Mana-Mou, was highweighted in England at 14 furlongs and longer. Anna of Saxony is the dam and grandam of French Group 3 winners Anna Palariva (Ire) and Anna Salai, respectively, the latter running a valiant second in this year's Etihad Airways Irish One Thousand Guineas (Ire-G1).

Anchoring this tribe is Ave's fourth dam, Anna Paola, a champion filly in Germany at both two and three. She also is the matriarch of German classic winner Anna Monda.

Ave hails from the ninth crop of Danehill Dancer, who topped England's and Ireland's leading sire list in 2009.

Standing at Coolmore Ireland, Danehill Dancer also has been represented in 2010 by multiple Group 1-winning three-year-old filly Lillie Langtry (Ire) as well as the gelding Super Satin, winner of this year's Mercedes Benz Hong Kong Derby.

Like many other contemporary runners bred for turf, Ave is most closely inbred to Northern Dancer. More specifically, however, Ave's paternal grandsire, Danehill, is a descendant of his own grandsire's breed-shaping clan. So what looks like 4x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer really is inbreeding to the family of Northern Dancer via three strains from his dam, Natalma, 5x5x5.

A good number of successful international runners have been designed in a similar manner.
