Concord Point's family tree features similarly bred parents

Concord Point responded to a series of challenges from Exhi and held off that foe to score a game one-length victory in the \$750,000 West Virginia Derby (G2) on August 7 at Mountaineer Race Track.

Sent off as the 4-to-5 favorite in a field of nine, the three-year old



Tapit colt covered 1½ miles in 1:51.12 on a track rated as fast.

The win marked Concord Point's second Derby conquest in as many starts. On June 26, he rolled to an 81/2length victory at Prairie Meadows Racetrack in the Iowa Derby (G3), taking the race in track-record time as he made his first start on dirt.

Two races back in the one-

turn Lazaro Barrera Memorial Stakes (G3) at Hollywood Park, he finished a close second to subsequent Bing Crosby Stakes (G1) winner Smiling Tiger.

With the West Virginia Derby victory, Concord Point improved to four wins and one second from six starts, and his bankroll nearly tripled to \$669,260.

Bred in Kentucky by Lee McMillin and Ed Rudley, the gray or roan colt made three appearances in the auction ring, including the 2008 Keeneland September yearling sale, when he brought \$220,000.

Concord Point is one of two winners from as many starters out of the winning Boston Harbor mare Harve de Grace, a half sister to twotime Grade 3 winner Tasha's Miracle, by Harlan's Holiday.

Our subject gets his name from the site of a historic Maryland lighthouse located not far from the site of the old Havre de Grace racetrack (1912-'50).

Concord Point is only the third graded stakes winner to be issued by his American female family, a tribe initiated by the importation of his sixth dam, the Argentine mare *Ondine II.

His third dam, A Penny Is a Penny, captured a trio of graded stakes

in 1990, including the Molly Pitcher Handicap (G2).

Concord Point hails from the second crop of the popular Gainesway stallion Tapit, whose current roster of talented sophomores also includes IZOD Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1) runner-up Trappe Shot.

In terms of structure, the top and bottom halves of Concord Point's pedigree show remarkable similarity.

Both his sire and dam are by paternal grandsons of Seattle Slew. For good measure, Harve de Grace is out of a Relaunch mare while Tapit is out of a granddaughter of Relaunch's full sister, Moon Glitter.

It almost goes without saying, the cross of full sister and brother has been a well-practiced pattern for success throughout the long history of breeding Thoroughbreds.
