

Criticism continues family's success in The Very One Stakes

Front-running Criticism (GB) was the beneficiary of her own pedestrian pace as she burst clear of her rivals at the head of the stretch en route to an impressive 2½-length victory in the \$100,000 The Very One Stakes (G3) on February 22.



Sent off as the 2-to-1 favorite, the five-year-old Darley homebred Machiavellian mare covered 1% miles in 2:15.23 on firm turf at Gulfstream Park.

Remarkably, Criticism became the third member of her immediate family to capture The Very One during the past decade.

Bred in England and unraced at two, Criticism won four of her 12

starts as a three-year-old in France, where she was a listed stakes winner and group placed. Her two starts at age four last year in the United States include her most recent outing, a one-length victory in the Long Island Handicap (G3) on November 1 at Aqueduct.

The improving bay mare has won six races from 15 lifetime starts and has bankrolled \$355,367.

The bottom half of Criticism's pedigree is particularly rich in staying influences. Her dam, the multiple graded stakes-winning Caerleon mare Innuendo (Ire), annexed the 2001 The Very One Handicap. A year later, Innuendo's half sister Moon Queen (Ire), by Sadler's Wells, came home on top in the same race.

Criticism's talented grandam Infamy (Ire), by 1978 Epsom Derby (Eng-G1) winner Shirley Heights, was a European highweight at age four when she crossed the Atlantic to beat males in the 1988 Rothmans International Stakes (Can-G1) at $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The tribe is anchored by Criticism's fourth dam, Sunbittern. She is the matriarch of at least 22 graded and group stakes winners, including 1990 Breeders' Cup Turf (G1) winner and sire In The Wings (GB) as well as the European classic winners High-Rise (Ire), Dubawi, Virginia Waters, and Zomaradah (GB).

Criticism hails from the 13th and penultimate crop of Machiavel-

lian, Mr. Prospector's most productive son to stand in Europe. Standing at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, he died from complications of laminitis in June 2004 at age 17.

Machiavellian always has enjoyed a strong affinity with Northern Dancer-line mares, and it does not seem a coincidence that the maternal half of his pedigree features two complementary strains of Almahmoud—one via his grandam, Raise the Standard, Northern Dancer's half sister. As it stands, Northern Dancer has appeared along the broodmare sire line in 48 of Machiavellian's 76 stakes winners.

All of this should help to explain why the Machiavellian approach to Innuendo can lead to Criticism, if not a return to Infamy.
