## Final Mesa rises to the occasion in Old Hat Stakes

Taking the lead at the quarter pole, Final Mesa edged clear through the stretch to lay claim to her first graded stakes victory by 1¾ widen-



ing lengths in the \$100,000 Old Hat Stakes (G3) on January 5, opening day of Gulfstream Park's winterspring meeting.

The three-year old Sky Mesa filly covered six furlongs in 1:09.75 on a track rated as fast.

The win was the bay filly's fourth from five career starts, all run at different tracks. Last year,

she captured the 4½-furlong Polly Drummond Stakes at Delaware Park in May followed by the My Dear Stakes at five furlongs in June at Woodbine. Her bankroll currently stands at \$202,377.

Bred in New York by Carmine Telesca and John Guerrera, Final Mesa was sold at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale for \$72,000 to her current owner and trainer Wesley Ward.

She is one of six winners from seven starters out of the unraced Smart Style mare Final Style, who also produced Uncle Camie, by Abaginone. He won the 2005 Bold Ruler Handicap (G3) and, more recently, he is a stallion in New York at Silvernails Farm.

Members of an otherwise small and quiet branch, Final Mesa and Uncle Camie are the only two individuals with black type to appear under their first three dams.

The overall racing class of this tail-female line is particularly meager given Final Mesa's second, third, fourth, and fifth dams all were unplaced with 14 combined unproductive starts.

Final Mesa hails from the fourth crop of Three Chimneys Farm denizen Sky Mesa, a Grade 1 winner who stands for a 2011 fee of \$30,000.

Final Mesa's family tree may reflect that of a five-generation outcross, but her extended pedigree demonstrates a particularly valuable series of inbreeding patterns.

Her fourth dam, The Bride, never hit the board in four lifetime starts. It may be recalled that The Bride was Secretariat's older full sister, a dark bay or brown filly who became the property of Ogden Phipps as a result of the providential coin toss that sent "Big Red" to Meadow Stud and Penny Tweedy Chenery.

The great Secretariat—whose maternal influence continues to abound—appears twice, 4x4, within Sky Mesa's pedigree, generating an auspicious cross of this legendary runner and progenitor with his exceedingly less-celebrated full sister.

For good measure, Final Mesa's pedigree is reinforced by a rich network of complementary strains (eight, in all) tracing back to foundation matriarch \*La Troienne, Sky Mesa's seventh dam.

The accumulation of this elite family's strains has, indeed, become a successful method of linebreeding for representatives of the A.P. Indy sire line.
