

## Jerome winner is regally bred, not to mention aptly named

After a brief duel with Kensei at the head of the Belmont Park stretch. Girolamo drew clear of his more accomplished opponent en route to a convincing 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length victory in the \$147,000 Jerome Handicap (G2) on October 11.

The Jerome marked the first stakes triumph for the lightly raced three-year-old A.P. Indy colt, who covered one mile in a swift 1:33.81 on a track rated as fast.

The winner's name would seem remarkably fitting, if not prophetic, as Girolamo is indeed the Italian equivalent of Jerome. A winner of four races from six lifetime starts. Godolphin Racing's dark bay or brown colt has won \$201.300.

Bred in Kentucky by B. P. Walden, P. Steinberg, and WinStar Farm, Girolamo's five-generation pedigree is a virtual compendium of America's most influential sires and dams during the second half of the 20th

century.

The mating of his breed-shaping sire, A.P. Indy, to his Grade 3winning dam. Get Lucky, has produced a total of six foals, including three-time graded stakes winner Daydreaming, Grade 3 winner Accelerator, and unraced She's

and leading Marvland sire Not For Love.

As one descends Girolamo's illustrious tail-female line, his ancestors and key relatives get no less distinguished.

His second dam. Dance Number, captured the 1983 Beldame Stakes (G1). This also is the immediate family of last year's Suburban Handicap (G1) winner Frost Giant and Central Kentucky sire Mutakddim.

Numbered Account, Girolamo's third dam, was 1971 champion twoyear old filly and the dam of influential sire Private Account among others.

Girolamo represents the 14th graded stakes winner sired by A.P. Indv out of a Mr. Prospector mare. The list also features 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft and the influential sire Pulpit. Additional stal-

lions sporting this prominent cross include Malibu Moon and Flatter.

The ongoing affinity between Girolamo's grand sires, Seattle Slew and Mr. Prospector-both descendants of the great matriarch Myrtlewood-remains one of the strongest and longest-lasting in the Thoroughbred world.

This pedigree also is reinforced through a network of complementary strains tracing back to Girolamo's eighth dam, the great matron \*La Troienne. Her great-grandson Buckpasser and greatgranddaughter Glamour are duplicated within our subject's fourth and fifth generation, respectively.

As such, Girolamo's pedigree benefits from the formation of multiple inbreeding patterns along his celebrated tail-female line.

This, then, is a pedigree that operates even beyond the hefty sum of all of its impressive parts. Simply put, it enjoys all of the best.
