

Princess Rooney winner has a sharp pedigree—Axe and all

Six-year-old Jessica Is Back succeeded in notching her first graded stakes victory at the Grade 1 level as the Put It Back mare rallied late to go by favored Werblin inside the sixteenth pole and draw off by two lengths in the \$350,000 Princess Rooney Handicap (G1)—the head-



line event on the Summit of Speed program on July 10 at Calder Race Course.

Sent off as the 8.50-to-1 seventh choice in a field of 11, Jessica Is Back stopped the clock in 1:11.48 for six furlongs on a track rated as fast.

In her most recent outing, she was an early pacesetter before fading to third, 12½ lengths behind

Rachel Alexandra, in the 1½-mile Fleur de Lis Handicap (G2) on June 12 at Churchill Downs.

Awinner in 12 of 44 lifetime starts, Jessica Is Back twice has changed hands through the claim box. The durable chestnut has shown a preference for Calder, where she has won seven races and been second five other times from 18 starts. Her career earnings currently stand at \$771.765.

Bred in Florida by Larry Perkins, Jessica Is Back is one of six winners from as many starters out of the Jolie's Halo mare Jessica's Halo, a two-time winner at age three.

Jessica's Halo is a half sister to multiple stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Island Delay, by Island Whirl. This also is the family of 2008 Gulfstream Park Handicap (G2) winner Sir Whimsey.

Jessica Is Back hails from the second crop of the Honour and Glory stallion Put It Back, who stands at Bridlewood Farm in Ocala. The former Grade 2-winning sprinter also shuttles annually to Haras Santa Maria de Araras in Brazil, where he is the sire of three local champions.

Our subject's broodmare sire, Jolie's Halo, also served stud duty at Bridlewood prior to his export and subsequent demise in Japan.

So far, the cross of Put It Back with Jolie's Halo broodmares has been a remarkably effective one. From eight foals of racing age, four have become stakes winners, including multiple graded winner Smokey Stover.

Jessica Is Back's extended pedigree reveals a rich network of complementary family strains. Not only is her closest pattern of inbreeding to The Axe II, 5x4, but she also carries the cross of two of his closest relatives—Francis S. and Nasomo, 5x4. Their common dam, Blue Eyed Momo, is a half sister to Blackball, the dam of The Axe II.

This represents a rare and valuable accumulation of influence, the origin which is The Axe's grandam, Big Event—a key daughter of the legendary matriarch *La Troienne.
