

Lookin At Lucky becomes his sire's second Preakness champion

Lookin At Lucky brought an end to his high-profile string of troubled trips as he scored an unencumbered three-quarter-length victory in the 135th running of the Preakness Stakes (G1) on May 15 at Pimlico Race Course.

There was a time-mid-20th century, in particular-when it was common for males who were recognized as juvenile champions to come back and win the Preakness at three. Remarkably, since 1980, Lookin At Lucky and Timber Country (in '95) are the only two to do so.

Our subject is the second colt by Smart Strike to win the Preakness

following Curlin in 2007.

Smart Strike joins eight other stallions who have sired a pair of Preakness winners. Heading this list are the legendary progenitors Lexington and Broomstick, both of whom sired three.

Lookin At Lucky is the 12th tailmale descendant of Mr. Prospector and the eighth in the past 11 years to capture the middle jewel of the Triple Crown (see accompanying table).

Never in Preakness history has one particular male line become so dominant. Of course, the same could be said of Mr. Prospector and the Triple Crown as a whole.

On the female side, prominent members of Lookin At Lucky's immediate family include his half brother, multiple Grade 2 winner Kensei: his third dam, 1978 Monmouth Oaks (G1) winner Sharp Belle; and champion three-yearold filly Wait a While.

Lookin At Lucky's extended female family has produced two Preakness winners. His tenth dam. *Colonial, by *Trenton, also served as the grandam of Nellie

Lookin At Lucky's pedigree is remarkably similar to that of 2009 Arkansas Derby (G2) winner and former classics starter Papa Clem. Both are by Smart Strike and out of Belong to Me mares who demonstrate close inbreeding to Northern Dancer.

The affinity Smart Strike has enjoved with Danzig-line broodmares originally was hinted at by his half sister. Danzig's best daughter. Rac-

ing Hall of Famer Dance Smartly. So far, three of Smart Strike's nine Grade 1 winners have been out of Danzig-line mares.

Lookin At Lucky is strongly inbred to his tail-male line as his dam contributes a second strain of his paternal great-grandsire. Raise a Native, along with a whopping five strains of Native Dancer.

The profound influence of Native Dancer on both halves of Thoroughbred pedigrees has rendered this pattern increasingly ubiquitous.
