## Midships coasts to victory in San Juan Capistrano

Staying specialist Midships enjoyed a near perfect trip as he set an unpressured pace and remained full of run through the stretch to



score a resounding three-quarterlength win in the \$196,000 San Juan Capistrano Invitational Handicap (G2) on April 19, closing day of the Santa Anita Park meet.

The four-year-old Mizzen Mast colt completed the 1¾-mile test, America's longest graded stakes race, in 2:49.26 on firm turf.

MIDSHIPS

In his previous start on March 21,

Midships won the 1½-mile San Luis Rey Handicap (G2) in similar wire-to-wire fashion. His most recent victory makes him the 14th horse to complete the San Luis Rey-San Juan Capistrano double in the same year (see adjoining chart).

Midships began his racing career in England, where he won two of his ten starts at ages two and three. Shipped to the United States, he finished third in the 2008 Hollywood Derby (G1) in November in his debut for trainer Bobby Frankel.

The gray or roan colt has a bankroll of \$345,475 with a career mark of four wins in 14 lifetime starts.

Ultra-rich in stamina influences, Midships's pedigree could, quite appropriately, be described as that of a contemporary American marathon runner.

Bred in Kentucky by Juddmonte Farms, who also bred his sire and dam, Midships is one of six winners from seven starters out of the Sadler's Wells mare Interim (GB).

A stakes winner at three in England, Interim was sent to the U.S., where she improved at age four

to annex a pair of graded stakes races, including the 1½-mile La Prevoyante Handicap (G2) at Calder Race Course.

A close relative to Interim is Short Pause, by Sadler's Wells out of

Interim's half sister Interval. Short Pause won the 2,400-meter (11.93-furlong) Prix d'Hedouville (Fr-G3) and was multiple group-stakes placed at the same distance.

Midship's older half brother Staging Post is multiple graded stakesplaced, including a runner-up finish in the 2002 San Juan Capistrano.

Further back, Midships's most distinguished family members are no less stout. This is the clan of champion turf female Wandesta and French Group 1 winner Zambezi Sun (GB).

Midships hails from the second crop of the Grade 1 winner Mizzen Mast, who stands at Juddmonte Farms in Lexington with an advertised 2009 fee of \$17,500.

Mizzen Mast's best runners have been effective on a wide range of racing surfaces—a particularly useful trait already attributed to the versatile Cozzene/Caro (Ire) sire line.

Midships inherited his gray coat from his fifth generation paternal sire Grey Sovereign. The dominant gray or roan gene passed from father to son along Midships's tail-male line.
