

Musket Man finds Illinois Derby within range

Unhurried early on, Musket Man made a bold sweeping move going into the far turn before pulling clear approaching the stretch



to register an impressive twolength victory in the \$500,000 Illinois Derby (G2) on April 4 at Hawthorne Race Course.

The 1^k-mile race marked the second straight graded stakes win for the Yonaguska colt. On March 14, he captured the Tampa Bay Derby (G3) by a neck.

Winner of five of his six lifetime

starts, Musket Man's overall bankroll of \$572,600 includes \$485,000 in graded stakes earnings, more than enough to assure the colt of a starting berth in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) field, which is determined by graded stakes earnings if more than 20 horses are entered.

To succeed, however, Derby-bound Musket Man will have to overcome his pedigree—one that suggests the 1¹/₄-mile classic could be beyond his scope.

Bred in Kentucky by Jim E. Nelson and Sergio De Sousa, the dark bay or brown colt was bought for \$15,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September yearling sale.

Musket Man is one of six winners from as many starters out of the stakes-placed winning Fortunate Prospect mare Fortuesque.

Musket Man also has a two-year-old three-quarter brother by Cherokee Run and a yearling half sister by Forest Danger.

Their dam, Fortuesque, was stakes-placed (via disqualification) while starting 17 times at ages two and three. A dedicated sprinter, Fortuesque won five races from distances of $5\frac{1}{2}$ to $6\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs, all at Calder Race Course.

Musket Man's broodmare sire, career sprinter Fortunate Prospect, upset future Hall of Famer Precisionist in the seven-furlong San Vicente Stakes (G3) in 1984.

The majority of Musket Man's immediate family could be described as a rather undistinguished lot. In a rare show of pronounced class, his third dam, Moment's Prayer, also serves as third dam to 1998 European juvenile highweight Mujahid.

Further back, Musket Man's fifth dam, Prayer Bell, produced 1969 juvenile champion colt Silent Screen.

Musket Man hails from the third crop of the Cherokee Run stallion Yonaguska and is his sire's first graded stakes winner.

After six seasons at Vinery in Kentucky, Yonaguska now stands at Elite Thoroughbreds in Folsom, Louisiana, for a 2009 fee of \$4,000.

Winner of the Hopeful Stakes (G1) at two and a trio of graded sprint stakes at three, Yonaguska has, so far, continued his male line's proclivity toward sprinters and milers.

More to the point, the swift Cherokee Run sire line may indeed be expanding, but it has yet to generate the winner of an important race at a classic distance.

Now that The Pamplemousse (by the Cherokee Run stallion Kafwain) has fallen off the Derby trail, there is Musket Man with his sprinter's pedigree still aimed at flying in the face of convention.
