## Adirondack winner carries clever double dose of key matron

Talented two-year old Position Limit lifted her investors' spirits as the Bellamy Road filly became her sire's first graded stakes winner, drawing off to an emphatic five-length victory in the \$150,000 Adirondack Stakes (G2) on August 15 at Saratoga Race Course.

Sent off as the 1.55-to-1 favorite in a field often, Position Limit covered 6½ furlongs 1:17.30 on a track rated as fast.

Unbeaten and untested in her first two starts, the dark bay or brown filly made her debut on July 14, rolling to a commanding 6%-length victory on a muddy track in a maiden special weight race at Belmont Park. She will be pointed to the Frizette Stakes (G1) at Belmont on October 9.

Bred in Virginia by Lazy Lane Farms, Position Limit fetched \$55,000 as a yearling

at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale of selected yearlings.

She is the first starter out of the winning Out of Place mare Payable On Demand, a half sibling to Grade 2-placed stakes winner Sum Trick and Disappearing Trick, a pair of colts by Favorite Trick who captured the 2002 and '05 editions of the Riley Allison Futurity at Sunland Park, respectively.

Position Limit's immediate family is anchored by her stakes winning third dam, Sumatra, who foaled 1981 Belmont Stakes (G1)

man sire, Bellamy Road, will be remembered as a runner for his spectacular 17½ length victory in the 2005 Wood Memorial Stakes (G1).

Standing at Pauls Mill in Versailles, Kentucky, he has five winners from 17 starters in his first crop through Tuesday.

The most remarkable aspect of Position Limit's overall pedigree may be that her sire and broodmare sire descend from the same family. Indeed, both Bellamy Road and Out of Place trace back to a common matriarch, the influential Damascus mare Arabian Dancer.

Brilliant in her own right, Arabian Dancer was retired after breaking a cannon bone while finishing second (her only lifetime defeat) to subsequent champion two-year-old filly Before Dawn in the 1981 Matron Stakes (G1).

Arabian Dancer's novel 5x3 duplication within our subject's family tree is yet another valuable demonstration of female family inbreeding.
