

Quality Road paves his way to the spring classics

A well-positioned stalker early on, Quality Road held off a furious bid from 11-to-10 favorite Dunkirk near the top of the Gulfstream Park stretch before edging away to an emphatic 1³/₄-length victory in the \$750,000 Florida Derby Presented by Blackberry (G1) on

March 28.

The Florida Derby was the first start around two turns for Quality Road, who set a track record as he covered 1¹/₈ miles on a fast track in 1:47.72—an effort that clearly established the Elusive Quality colt as a prime contender for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) on May 2.

Quality Road was a 4¹/₄-length winner of the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream in his previous start. The bay Edward P. Evans homebred has won three of his four lifetime starts and earned \$632,830.

Quality Road's stalking style and Derby-friendly pedigree figure to make him particularly dangerous in the first leg of this year's Triple Crown.

Bred in Virginia by Evans, he is one of two winners from three starters out of the Strawberry Road (Aus) mare Kobla.

Unplaced in two starts at age three, Kobla is a full sister to 1997 champion three-year-old filly Ajina, winner of the 1¹/₄-mile Coaching Club American Oaks (G1). Kobla's half brother, turf runner Rob's Spirit, by

Theatrical (Ire), won the 2000 Lexington Stakes (G3) and Saranac Handicap (G3), the former at 1¹/₄ miles. Kobla's dam, Winglet, captured a Grade 2 race at 1¹/₄ miles.

Quality Road's immediate family is anchored by his third dam, Ireland's

1974 two-year-old champion filly Highest Trump. Classic-placed at three, she is the matriarch of 11 group or graded stakes winners, including top English miler and sire Bahri.

Quality Road's classic quest appears well supported by the sires of his first three dams. Australian Horse of the Year Strawberry Road, Alydar, and Bold Bidder all are primary influences of stamina.

Quality Road's tail-female line traces back to his seventh dam, the influential matriarch Myrtlewood, who also appears in this extended pedigree as the fourth dam of our subject's paternal great-grandsire, Mr. Prospector.

Additional family patterns feature Graustark with his Racing Hall of Fame half sister Bowl of Flowers, 5x4, and Tim Tam with his half brother On-and-On, 5x5.

Quality Road hails from the seventh North American crop of the Gone West shuttle stallion Elusive Quality, best known for siring dual classic winner Smarty Jones as well as last year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Raven's Pass.

To date, only three horses have won the Fountain of Youth, the Florida Derby, and the Kentucky Derby in succession: the aforementioned Tim Tam in 1958, Spectacular Bid in 1979, and Thunder Gulch in 1995.
