Spinaway winner closely inbred to great grandsire Forty Niner

Reserved early, E. Paul Robsham's homebred R Heat Lightning circled her rivals on the far turn, took the lead near the sixteenth pole, and thundered to a commanding four-length victory in the \$250,000 Spinaway Stakes (G1) on September 5 at Saratoga Race Course.

It was an auspicious first stakes victory for the two-year-old Trippi

filly, who was clocked in a relatively tepid 1:25.23 for seven furlongs on the main track.

R Heat Lightning won by five lengths in her maiden debut on July 5 at Delaware Park. Prior to the Spinaway, she finished second, one length behind Twelve Pack Shelly, in the Colleen Stakes on August 7 at Monmouth Park.

The Florida-bred bay filly will be pointed to the Frizette Stakes (G1)

on October 9 at Belmont Park.

R Heat Lightning is the second winner from as many starters out of the Gold Fever filly Yellow Heat, a winner of three of five career starts as a three-year-old.

Yellow Heat was purchased for \$145,000 at the 2003 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. March sale of selected two-year-olds in training. Her first foal, our subject's three-year-old full sister Hot Trip, is a multiple winner and stakes-placed this season.

R Heat Lightning is the first stakes winner to appear under her first three dams. Until now, hers was a relatively small and quiet branch of an otherwise successful female family.

This clan is anchored by R Heat Lightning's stakes-winning fourth dam, Exclusive Dancer, a three-quarter sister to influential stallion Exclusive Native and the dam of multiple Grade 1 winner and sire General Assembly.

Indeed, Exclusive Dancer serves as matriarch to a growing number of important runners and progenitors, including Grade 1 winners Versailles Treaty, Chief Honcho, Bellamy Road, and Gold Fever, who appears in the above pedigree as Yellow Heat's sire.

As such, Yellow Heat's parents are descendants of the same family, creating inbreeding to their common matron Exclusive Dancer, 5x3.

R Heat Lightning hails from the sixth crop of the End Sweep stallion Trippi and is the latest of his four American graded stakes winners, his first at the Grade 1 level.

A former Grade 1-winning sprinter, Trippi was a Florida-leading sire before his export to South Africa following the 2008 season.

R Heat Lightning represents the first graded stakes winner inbred to 1987 champion two-year-old male Forty Niner, who appears in this pedigree as the paternal grandsire of both her sire and dam.

So far, close inbreeding to sons of Mr. Prospector has not been a recipe for success. But, of course, Lightning can always strike twice.
