The Pamplemousse wins well clear of foes in Sham Stakes

For a pacesetting classics hopeful with the pedigree of a sprintermiler, The Pamplemousse looked like a horse who could run all day



as he notched an overpowering six-length victory in the \$200,000 Sham Stakes (G3), a 1½-mile race on February 28 at Santa Anita Park.

The heavily favored three-yearold Kafwain colt drew off to win in a stakes-record 1:47.86 on the synthetic Pro-Ride surface.

The Pamplemousse has won three in a row since being

stretched out to two turns. The strapping gray or roan colt held off Grade 1 winner Square Eddie by two lengths in the San Rafael Stakes (G3) at one mile on January 17 in his start prior to the Sham.

The Pamplemousse, which means "grapefruit" in French, is scheduled to make his final prep for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands! (G1) on April 4 in the 1½-mile Santa Anita Derby (G1).

If he does earn a trip to Churchill Downs, The Pamplemousse will be competing on dirt for the first time. There will also be the much greater issue as to whether he can succeed at the Derby's 1¼-mile distance.

Bred in Kentucky by Fred and Nancy Mitchell's Clarkland Farm in Lexington, The Pamplemousse is one of four winners from as many

starters out of the Rubiano mare Comfort Zone, winner of a pair of sprint races as a two-year-old.

The Pamplemousse's grandam, So Cozy, won two of her four lifetime starts as a juvenile, including a six-furlong stakes at Suffolk Downs. The overwhelming majority of her descendants, including 14 stakes winners, have been sprinter-milers as well.

Comfort Zone's half sister, Wilshewed, by Carson City, is the dam of Stormello, by Stormy Atlantic, a Grade 1-winning juvenile who finished 19th of 20 in the 2007 Kentucky Derby.

Anchoring his immediate family is The Pamplemousse's third dam, Special Warmth, a four-time stakes winner at two, including the 1976 Arlington-Washington Lassie Stakes (G2) at six furlongs. Bred by Old English Rancho, Special Warmth has a pedigree that typified California's long-term emphasis on speed. Her swift tribe includes brilliant fillies Fleet Treat and Impressive Style.

In the few cases when this clan has issued a quality individual who could go a route of ground, the individuals could attest to stamina from their sire and/or grandsires.

Not so with The Pamplemousse. Virtually all of the demonstrable influences from his key male ancestors are those of a sprinter-miler. In this regard, the Cherokee Run sire line is yet to generate the winner of an important race run at a classic distance.

The Pamplemousse hails from the second crop of Kafwain, one of his generation's best two-year-olds, but another who went on to find the Derby beyond his reach.

Conventional pedigree analysis suggests The Pamplemousse would be similarly vulnerable.
