## Zardana steps out of stablemate's shadow to defeat Rachel Alexandra

Rather than starting Zardana (Brz) against her undefeated stablemate, Zenyatta, in the Santa Margarita Invitational Handicap (G1) on March 13 at Santa Anita Park, trainer John Shirreffs shipped his lesser accomplished six-year old mare to Fair Grounds for the \$200,000 New Orleans Ladies Stakes at 1½ miles the same day.

It was thought the Grade 2-winning Zardana might serve as a useful foil, if not measuring rod, in what was the season debut of reigning Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra.

So much for plans of mice and men as Zardana stunned the crowd by outfinishing the champion filly and prohibitive 1-to-20 favorite by three-quarters of a length. Third-place finisher Unforgotten finished another 11½ lengths back in third in the five-horse field.



The following morning came the announcement of Rachel Alexandra's defection from her highly anticipated ultrarich showdown with Zenyatta in the Apple Blossom Invitational Stakes (G1) on April 9 at Oaklawn Park.

The New Orleans Ladies Stakes was Zardana's first race on dirt since capturing her first three starts by a combined margin of 39 lengths as

a two-year-old at Hipodromo La Gavea in her native Brazil.

Subsequently purchased and imported to the U.S. by Arnold Zetcher, Zardana's victories in Southern California include last year's Bayakoa Handicap (G2) at Hollywood Park and the 2008 Osunitas Handicap on the turf at Del Mar. Her career record stands at eight wins from 19 starts and earnings of \$428,421.

Bred by Haras Campestre, Zardana is one of four winners from as many starters out of the winning Southern Halo mare Dear Filly, a half sister to Brazilian Group 2 winner Minion, by Mutakddim.

Dear Filly also is closely related to two Argentine Group 1 winners, Matthis and My Lad, both by Southern Halo out of Mystique.

In turn, Zardana's third dam, Mystique, is a half sister to Malaga (Arg) and Mustard (Arg), Argentine classic winners and champion three-year-old fillies of 1981 and '83, respectively, by Salt Marsh.

This tail-female line has been producing important runners in South

America since Zardana's 13th dam, Tears, by Blair Athol, was sent from England to Argentina in 1881.

Zardana hails from the second crop of the Sadler's Wells stallion Crimson Tide, who stands in Brazil at Haras Bage do Sul. He is the sire of seven group or graded stakes winners.

Once synonymous with the issue of turf runners, the Sadler's Wells male line continues to make inroads amongst the many dirt tracks of the Western Hemisphere.

A group stakes winner in England and Germany, Crimson Tide's pedigree features the successful affinity of Sadler's Wells and Darshaan along with a close 3x3 cross of the full siblings Special and Thatch.

Alternatively, Zardana's pedigree is built on three strains of Northern Dancer and supported by another from his close relative Halo, creating inbreeding to their common grandam, Almahmoud.
